

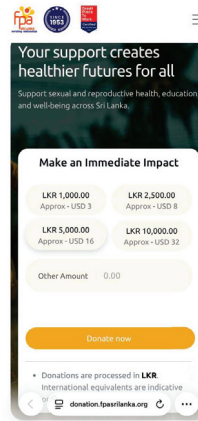

Strengthening International Partnerships: Learning Visit to RFSU

Executive Director Dr. Ruchitha Perera, Director of Marketing Mr. Suhail Junaid, and Project Consultant Ms. Desaree Soysa conducted a learning visit to RFSU (IPPF Sweden). The delegation shared FPA's organizational capabilities and project updates, while the RFSU team shared strategies and approaches within the project areas.

This ongoing partnership supports FPA's work in Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE), SRH awareness programmes for youth and the deaf community, medical termination of pregnancy, and prevention of sexual and gender-based violence.



Youth Action for Crisis Response in Nuwara Eliya

A youth camp in Nuwara Eliya, themed "Youth Action for Crisis Response," equipped participants with critical knowledge on sexual and reproductive health.

The session empowered youth to make informed decisions during crises. To promote dignity and wellbeing, menstrual kits were also distributed to all participants.

Youth Leaders Shaping Communities: Batticaloa & Koggala

Young leaders recently gathered at the Batticaloa and Koggala Service Delivery Points for quarterly planning and progress meetings. These sessions focused on Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE) targets and the role of youth as peer educators. By creating safe spaces and strengthening clinic referrals, these volunteers are building leadership and informed decision-making skills.



Bringing Essential Healthcare to Kilinochchi

In collaboration with the Civil Security Department and local health authorities, a mobile clinic was conducted in Iranamadu. The initiative provided vital services, including well-woman screenings, family planning, dental care, and NCD screenings.

This outreach remains a cornerstone of our mission to bridge healthcare gaps for those in remote areas.
