Creating Safe Spaces for Youth

Under the theme “Resilient Futures: Youth Action for Crisis Response,” FPA Sri Lanka has commenced Youth Camps for communities affected by Cyclone Ditwah across Kandy, Badulla, and Nuwara Eliya. A camp held in Doluwa, Gampola featured interactive learning sessions, games, and discussions. Representatives of the New Zealand High Commission and UNFPA Sri Lanka joined the programme.

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Supporting Youth Wellness at SHE'volve 2026

FPA Youth proudly partnered as the Official Health & Wellness Partner for SHE'volve 2026, organized by AIESEC in the University of Colombo. Held at the University Auditorium premises, the event focused on empowering young people through awareness, engagement, and wellness advocacy, while strengthening conversations around youth health, personal growth, and well-being within university communities.



Bringing Essential Health Services to Communities

FPA Sri Lanka's Medical Unit collaborated with the Faculty of Medicine, University of Colombo, for the “Wassana Diyawara” community medical camp in Mahagalwewa, Suriyawewa. Over 50 women accessed cervical cancer screening, breast examinations, and gynaecology consultations. The programme highlighted the value of partnerships in strengthening community access to essential sexual and reproductive healthcare services.



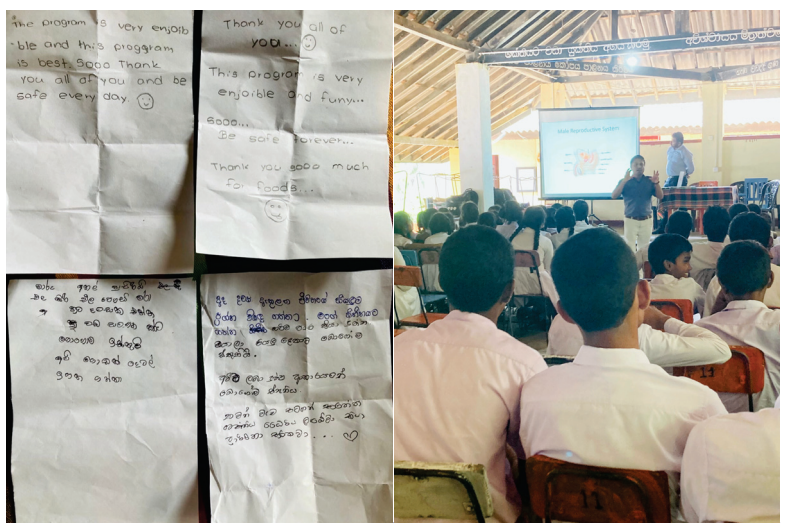
CSE Training for School Students in Batticaloa

Empowering Youth Through Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE)

FPA Youth, together with the Wathupitiwala SDP and Attanagalla Youth Corps, conducted a CSE programme for young participants. Sessions covered reproductive health, adolescence, contraception, and SOGIESC awareness, creating an engaging and inclusive learning space. The programme encouraged open dialogue, awareness, and understanding among youth on important health and rights-related topics.



Rhythm to Life: SRH Awareness for Adolescents

Alokaya Counselling Centre conducted the “Rhythm to Life” SRH Awareness Programme for students of Gonagala Maha Vidyalaya, Ruwanwella, in collaboration with MAS LEGATO Pvt. Ltd. Facilitated by Dr. Amila Chandrasiri, the session used songs as a core engagement tool to explore themes of relationships, health, and decision-making, helping adolescents connect familiar rhythms with meaningful conversations on sexual and reproductive health.



Mobile Clinic for Civil Security Department Staff

A mobile clinic session targeting the Civil Security Department staff of the Kanagapuram Camp, Ambal Nagar, was conducted in collaboration with the RDHS and Vision Care teams. The programme provided essential health services while strengthening access to care for camp communities through multi-sector collaboration and coordinated outreach efforts.



Interactive Youth Camp in Nuwara Eliya

The Nuwara Eliya SDP successfully conducted an interactive Youth Camp at the Vocational Training Authority (VTA), Nuwara Eliya under the UNFPA-supported project. The programme created a positive platform for young participants to engage in learning, teamwork, and discussions on leadership, resilience, and sexual and reproductive health while fostering stronger community connections among youth.
